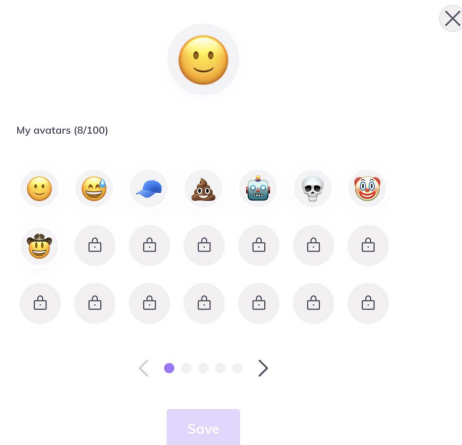
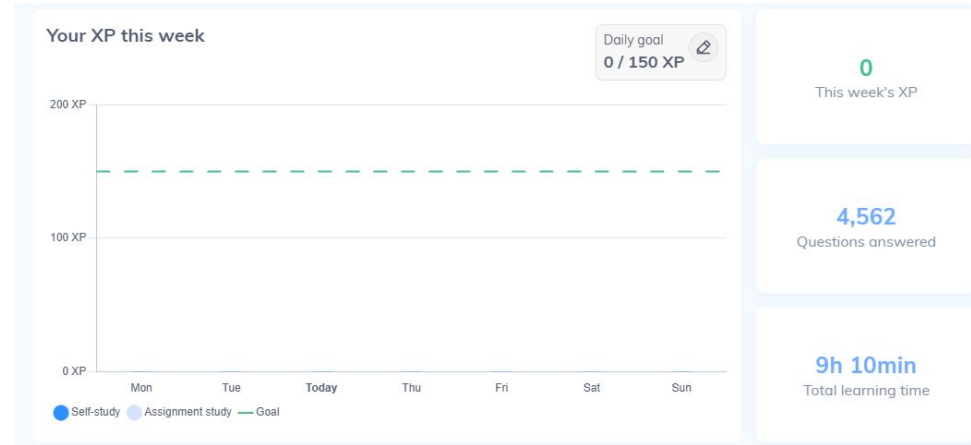

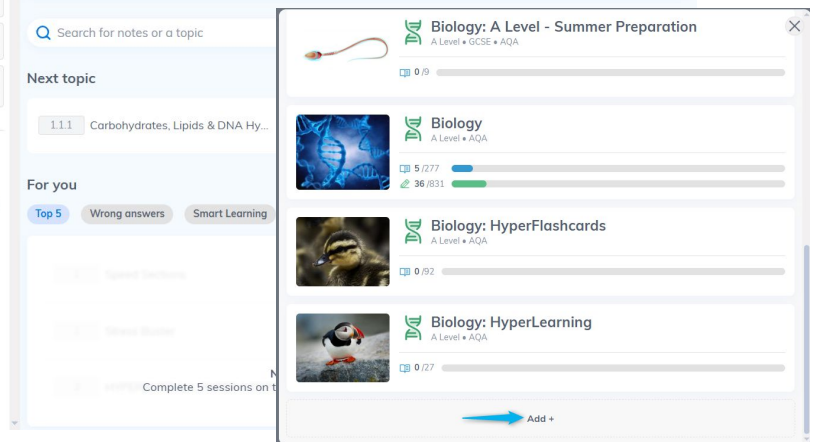
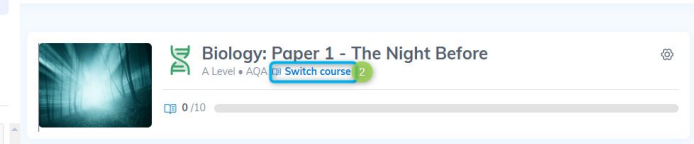
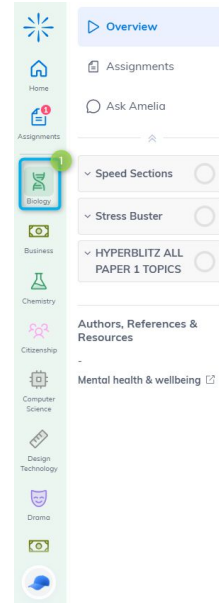
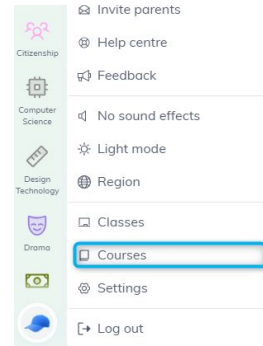
Subjects: Your Courses
